


Geography

We would like you to carry out some pre-reading, note taking and research over the summer. We work from two text books at A level (see below), these are available from student services at a reduced rate of £19.50 each or from amazon as hard copies or cheaper digital downloads. You will be working from book 1 in September. *If you opt for digital versions make sure you can view them easily in class, reading from a small mobile screen is not good enough.*

The first 2 topics we will study both appear in text 1. These are:

Topic 1: Tectonic Process and Hazards

Topic 3: Globalisation

Searching for the specific topic titles (in bold below) will bring up revision notes and information that will help.

Task 1: Read and make notes from topic 1, this looks at the **locations at risk from tectonic hazards** (pages 2-14 in BK1).

Task 2: Read and make notes from topic 3, this looks at **the acceleration of globalisation** (pages 160-178).

Task 3: Keep an eye on the national and international news and note down major events that relate to the two topics above. Be ready to discuss these on our return.

How to start making notes. *Read the pages one time over to start with, then read them again slowly noting down key bits of information including key terms and meanings. Use the textbook sub headings to help structure your notes. Turn the information into diagrams or simple sketches if this helps you learn.*
