- Section B – two from three essays (2 x 25 marks)

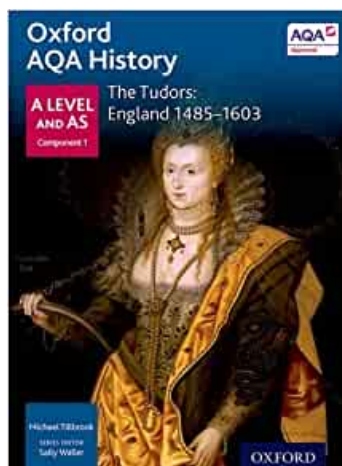
Yr 12 - Part one: consolidation of the Tudor Dynasty: England, 1485–1547
